
PRESIDENT'S LETTER 2023-2024

11th September 2023

Dear Member,

I am honoured to write to you as President of Belfast Royal Academy Old Boys' Association.

For anyone who does not know me, please let me introduce myself. I attended BRA from 1956 to 1968, starting with 2 years in Duncairn, then I went through Wingfield and into the 'Big School'. I enjoyed School, and also the physicality of playing rugby until, sadly, at 17



years of age, I was stopped from playing on medical grounds after being knocked out in a 1st XV Schools' Cup match and suffered the after effects from multiple concussions. I took an Honours Degree in Applied Mathematics and Computing at Queens, and worked in IT for 40 years consisting of: 3 years at Harland & Wolff, 2 at years UUJ at Jordanstown, and 35 years for IBM Asia Pacific based in Sydney, Australia. I worked mostly as a Project Manager travelling a lot around SE Asia, which I found very challenging and rewarding.

The Annual OBA Dinner is on Saturday 25th November at the Belfast Hilton

Hotel. This is our major event, and I ask you to please consider planning a table with your friends. This event provides a wonderful opportunity to catch up with friends, get an update on the school, and join many others for a very enjoyable evening. You do not have to be a member of the Old Boys' Association to attend this event, and you are welcome to invite guests.

Our annual calendar also includes combined Old Boys' and Old Girls' Dinners in London and Edinburgh. The London Dinner will be held in the RAF Club on Friday 8th March 2024, and the Edinburgh Dinner will be held on Friday 12th April 2024. If you live near London or Edinburgh I hope that many of you will join us. Thank you to all our younger members who have attended these Dinners in recent years and who are now contributing so much to the vitality of the OBA.

There are 9 other McKennas in our family who attended or taught at BRA. Firstly, my older brother, Brian (1965) taught Mathematics his whole career at BRA and Brian's wife, Isobel, who taught Maths and Chemistry at BRA. Their 3 children, Robin (1990) and his wife Shirley (nee Scott, 1991), Alan (1993) and Colin (1995) also attended the grammar school. My cousin Terry's 3 children, Judith (1978), Ian (1981) and Cathy (1983) also attended BRA. So I have no doubt that many people reading this letter will have played rugby with or against or were taught by, at least one of us!.

At the Academy I had many excellent teachers who inspired my interest in various subjects. Alfie Jamison (aka "Bronco") was my Form Master, Maths teacher in forms 1,2 & 3 and my rugby coach on the Medallion & 1st XV. It's fair to say that Bronco provided some discipline in the junior school (when I needed it) and was an inspiration on the rugby field. One happy memory from School is that we were the first BRA team to win the Medallion Shield outright. In that season we had 24 wins from 24 matches. That created a group of friends for life! Our coaches were Bronco & Davy Carruthers both of whom were key to that success.

I have been the OBA Hon. Secretary for the last 5 years and it has been a pleasure to work with Mrs Hilary Woods. I want to take this opportunity to thank Mrs Woods for her responsiveness and support during this time. Hilary's support is very important for the OBA and it is very much appreciated. In fact, I've been fortunate to benefit greatly from my experiences with the last six Principals of BRA and I'm very grateful to all of them.

Every year we lose a number of Old Boys of the Academy, and this year has been no exception. It is with great sadness that I record the passing of four Past Presidents: Professor Henry Halliday, Professor Robert McIlhagger, Albert Elliott and Robin Reid, all of whom made an enormous contribution to the Academy.

The primary objective of the OBA is to promote social interaction amongst Old Boys and maintain the links with BRA and the Old Girls. However, where the Old Boys' Association can raise funds through events such as the Annual Dinner in Belfast, special events and donations, we will make a financial contribution to School projects, with guidance from the Principal. This year's plans include a contribution to the new WW II Memorial, and to 'House Ties' for Form 1 boys beginning in September 2023.

The Old Boys' Golf Society continues to thrive under the guiding hand of Ken Knox and 42 golfers enjoyed the competition at Malone Golf Club in June where Ian Thompson won the Picken Cup with a score of 44 points.

The annual cricket match between an Old Boys' XI and the School 1st XI was played on 23rd June 2023. Although the weather threatened at times, it was a another very pleasant day in the stunning surroundings of the Castle Grounds which always triggers many happy memories of past events.
